

2022-2023 Student Activity Fee Student Organization Funding Report

The amount of the Student Activity Fee for 2022-23 was \$511 and was used to support the operation, maintenance, and debt service expenditures for Student Engagement and Campus Life and for support of various student organization programming activities as determined by the student organization funding boards, including the USS Appropriations committee, Graduate Student Budget Board and the Student Activity Fee Allocation Board. For 2022-23, \$2,292,715 was available to be allocated to support student organizations, which included a base allocation of \$1,165,595 for fiscal year 2022-23 and \$1,127,120 of unspent and/or unallocated funds carried forward from the prior fiscal year.

Student organizations who are categorized as Registered Student Organizations (per policy 8013) and University Student Life Programs (per policy 8011) applying for student activity fee funding must submit budget requests to be reviewed by the *Undergraduate Student Senate (USS) Appropriations Committee* OR Graduate Student Budget Board (GSBB). Students organizations categorized as University Chartered student Organizations (per policy 8012) submit budget requests to the Student Activity Fee Allocations Board (SAFAB), a joint committee of the student senates, for annual allocations. Only organizations that have registered with Student Engagement and Campus Life, are eligible to submit a budget request. All organizations may be asked to appear before the board to present their request and to answer questions of the board members. The USS Appropriations Committee is governed by funding policies approved by the Undergraduate Student Senate (USS) and the Graduate Student Budget Board is governed by funding policies approved by the Graduate and Professional Student Senate (GPSS). The decisions made by SAFAB are governed by policies that are approved by the joint committee on an annual basis.

The USS Appropriations Committee, a committee under USS, and the Graduate Student Budget Board, a committee under GPSS, are responsible for reviewing budget requests and making funding decisions for University Student Life Programs (USLP) and Registered Student Organizations (RSO). The Student Activity Fee Allocations Board (SAFAB) is responsible for review requests for University Chartered Student Organizations (UCSO). Its membership is composed of Virginia Tech students. The Graduate Student Budget Board is advised by the Assistant Director of Student Organizations and Development in Student Engagement and Campus Life, a full time, administrative staff member. The USS Appropriations Committee is advised by the Operations Coordinator for the Undergraduate Student Senate, a full time, administrative staff member. The Student Activity Fees Allocation Board is advised by the Associate Director for Student Organizations & Administration in Student Engagement and Campus Life, a full time, administrative staff member.
